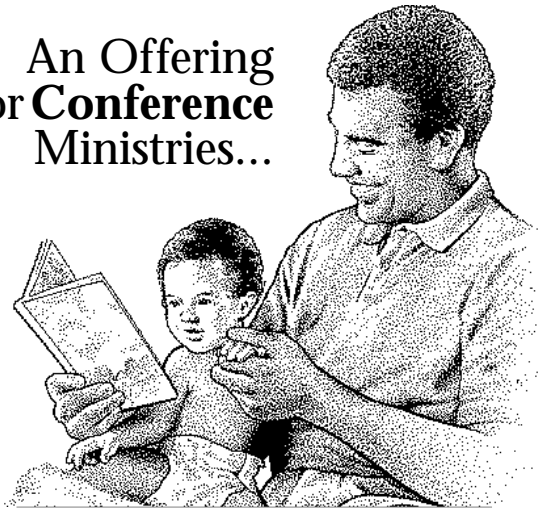

Although adoption is now a secondary program, it is still a major concern. The Society believes we have no throw-away children and it serves as the redemptive arm of the Church.
